EYES FOR THE WORLD (EFTW) PROJECT - ZAMBIA

EFTW project visit from 8th July 2018 to 12 July 2018

On Sunday evening 08 July, 2018, we welcomed the EFTW team of five comprising Sandy van Nierkerk, Chris Helsen, Carina, Christine and our EFTW Optometrist. Dr Koen Van Pottelbergh. The Agora ladies met the team at the airport and escorted them to the Mint Leaf Lodge (a lodge run by one of the Agora members), where they were all accommodated. Having all the guests stay in one place worked well for hospitality and logistical purposes.

Appointments for the EFTW project team were secured (well before the team arrived) in various institutions. In a little shift from the first visit where we only focused on school going children, this time, on day one, we visited the Matero aftercare center, a home for the aged. The facility is home to the elderly in our society that have been abandoned and neglected by their families.

The team quickly set up after a few formalities and introductions. By the end of the day, we screened **160 people and gave out 95 glasses**. What a joy it was to see all those happy faces after they received their glasses. A great reminder of why the EFTW project is close to our hearts (Veerle de Jong, ACI NL 6).

On the second and the third days, we visited three community schools, a local parish and Dr Argawal's eye hospital.







Agora Club Zambia has in the past worked with the Eye hospital for prescreening. On this particular visit, were extremely grateful to be allocated **40** *free consultation* slots for patients screened by EFTW but could not be helped due to various eye complications. The first to receive the free consultation is 12 year old **Hope Phiri** whom we met on the third day at Kamanga School.

Hope was born with Cataracts and received surgery as a baby to remove them. The initial operation was successful although her sight has been deteriorating over the years. After consultation, a number of tests were booked for her to further investigate the cause of deteriorating sight. Agora club Zambia will sponsor some of the tests required. By the two days, we managed to screen a total of *197 people and gave out 103 glasses*. Thanks to the project team who endured long hours of standing to facilitate the screening process, we registered successful accomplishment of the tasks.







On the last day, just before Sandy and Dr Koen left for the airport, we visited the Lusaka Eye Hospital, a faith based organization also involved as sight savers and working with the rural communities of Zambia. They were recipients of *52 pairs of glasses* to distribute to the under privileged in the remote areas. Dr Koen trained their ophthalmologist on how to use the glasses. The institution is looking forward to further partnerships with EFTW in championing the cause for sight to all.

By the end of the week, after a lot of hard work and travel to different sites, the team managed to screen a total of 357 people and distributed 250 pairs of glasses. It was a remarkably successful week. It was not all work for the EFTW team. The ladies managed a few hours of sightseeing in the city of Lusaka and surrounding game reserve areas. We had several dinners together and enjoyed watching the world cup. Fantastic fellowship and knowledge sharing.







Cub Agora Zambia is privileged to have been chosen as one of the beneficiary countries of the EFTW project. Our communities have really benefited from the project and we stand tall and proud to belong to such a wonderful family. The charitable service rendered to the under privileged, who cannot afford to pay for glasses, makes the work of the EFTW very special and endearing. The power to transform lives, especially the lives of those young school going children and the elderly, who, through this gift have been given a new leash of life is amazing.

Long live the EFTW project. Eyes truly make a difference in our lives!!!!

As the incoming president of the Agora Club Zimbabwe and our inspired members held our first international service project this year, between July the 5th and 7th, 2018, what an amazing time of friendship, service and cementing community ties it was. - The team that came to Zimbabwe included members from Austria, Belgium, The Netherlands, France and South Africa to work with the Ladies Circle and Agora Club Zimbabwe.





We knew we had succeeded when dozens of kids trying on their glasses for the first time couldn't contain their excitement and cried out "I can see!" This touched mine, and many other hearts that day. This result on its own proves our success and made us all more determined to continue with this and other future projects.

In the run up to the project, a small but dedicated team of Agora Zimbabwe and LCZ members, the Eye Institute and Optometrist Chris Kumora banded together to successfully pre-screen more than 1050 children. Many came from disadvantaged communities and from ALL over the country desperate for help.



Let Them Trust Schools Arts Festival acted as a platform to hand out glasses, inspire and entertain the children, of which is also run by myself, Chido Musasiwa-Gutu. Another thank you to Ruth Hungwe's whose guidance in organizing the project and in securing the partnership with the Ministry of Health was invaluable.





Despite the freezing weather and the high's and lows from the FIFA world Cup, we laughed, danced and celebrated friendship together.

Almost all the international guests were home hosted and some even managed to visit the historic Victoria Falls. This project really cemented Agora Club Zimbabwe.
